PRODUCT DESCRIPTION :

PermaPro Wax is a high gloss, non-yellowing acrylic floor polish for use on all types of sealed floors. PermaPro Wax is used to maintain floors in a brilliant polished condition with minimum of labor. All types of sealed concrete floors as well as sealed wood and composition floors will improve their appearance and decrease maintenance costs with the use of PermaPro Wax. Exist in 2 concentrations.

HOW TO USE:

1. Remove old polish thoroughly by scrubbing with PermaPro Degreaser. Rinse floor well and let dry completely.
2. Apply PermaPro Wax in a thin even coat over the floor using a clean yarn mop. Allow to dry completely, about 25 to 30 minutes. Apply a second coat and let dry completely before allowing traffic on the floor.

Maintenance: Occasional damp mopping with PermaPro Clean and Polish will maintain the smooth glossy surface. In Heavy Traffic areas, after mopping and rinsing, let dry and apply a thin coat of PermaPro Wax.

- Highly detergent resistant. PermaPro Wax is not harmed by repeated scrubbing with PermaPro Daily Cleaner.
